The 2018 Construction Season is Underway!

The City of North Branch has several streets throughout the city that are scheduled for a mill and overlay this summer. As part of this work, Maple Street, Branch Avenue, Elm Street, Glacier Drive, and Oakview Avenue will have a 6-ft mill next to the curb and will be overlaid with new bituminous pavement. The project is expected to start in the next two weeks and will last through mid-November.

Sprinkler Systems & Invisible Fences

If you have a sprinkler system or an underground invisible pet fence in the right-of-way or near the roadway, please contact Mike, the project's construction inspector. He will provide you with flags that you can use to mark the locations of these items.

Manhole Adjustments

As part of the overlaying process, the contractor will need to raise the manhole lids to match the new pavement height. Please be cautious and avoid driving over the raised manhole lids until the road is repaved.

Street Parking

Vehicles parked on the street during working hours make it difficult for the Contractor to work safely and can cause delays to the project. We understand that some residents need to park on the street and we will do our best to work with you individually to accommodate street parking. The Contractor will be periodically placing "No Parking" signs when a particular activity can't be performed with vehicles parked on the street. Please stay alert for these signs as their locations can change daily.

During construction there will be significant construction vehicle traffic within the project site that may restrict your ability to drive through the area. To keep everyone safe we ask that you please consider alternate routes during construction.
